HEALTH CARE RULING WON'T HIT TRICARE, VA

WASHINGTON — Thursday's Supreme Court decision upholding the constitutionality of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) could have far-reaching effects on American health care policy and politics over the next few years. What it won't do is affect any Tricare or Veterans Affairs health care coverage.

Lawmakers specifically exempted those systems from the health care debate in 2010, in response to concerns that the new rules and regulations could upset their patient care efforts. Congress also passed the Tricare Affirmation Act that year, adding an extra layer of exemption and protection.

Of course, military and veterans families still could see some changes

under the new rules. Already, those health care systems have seen their policies updated to allow children under 26 to remain on their parents' plans, mirroring the larger ACA provisions.

And veterans ineligible or unwilling to use VA health care options will be affected by the larger changes in private health insurance.

Republican House leaders have promised to work to repeal the measure, but that's unlikely as long as Democrats hold onto power in the Senate and White House.

DGMC LAUNCHES PERSONALIZED MEDICINE CLINICAL STUDY

David Grant USAF Medical Center recently hosted the first-ever recruitment and enrollment campaign for the Air Force's Personalized Medicine Clinical Utility Study.

The study, approved by the Air Force Research Laboratory's Institutional Review Board in accordance with Air Force Instruction 40-402, "Protection of Human Subjects in Biomedical and Behavioral Research" under protocol #FWR20110046 is part of the Air Force Medical Service's new patient-centered precision care and personalized medicine program, known as PC2-Z. The study is a forward-thinking program of the Air Force Surgeon General in collaboration with the Coriell Institute for Medical Research, the Johns Hopkins University's Applied Physics Laboratory and industry leaders in

the personalized medicine and biotechnology transfer arena, respectively.

"The primary goal of PC2-Z is to assess whether or not it is beneficial to provide people with personal genetic information about potentially actionable medical conditions or drug responses, and how having this information can better steer lifestyle choices," stated Lt. Col. (Dr.) Cecili Sessions, Air Force director of the Personalized Medicine Program. "In addition, the study aims to use patient demographics and genetic data to optimize best practices in the growing field of genetic medicine."

According to Dr. Sessions, the results of the study will help scientists understand how changes in our genes increase the risk of certain diseases, and how genetic variations affect the way certain medicines work.

"During a three-day recruiting event at DGMC, the PC2-Z team briefed interested active-duty AFMS participants on the basis for the study, expectations, and informed consent documentation," explained Sessions. "Local ombudsmen were identified from the Clinical Investigation Facility at Travis to oversee human subject recruitment and enrollment procedures.

As described by Dr. Sessions, after an informed consent video was viewed by participants, interested individuals

were talked through the necessary consent paperwork and a saliva sample was collected and given a unique barcode to protect the individual's identity and safeguard privacy. The saliva samples containing the individual's DNA were then sent to the Coriell Institute laboratory in New Jersey for testing to analyze for more than one million genetic variants.

"Within a few weeks, study participants will begin receiving results which provide their personalized risk assessment for a variety of health conditions including diabetes, hypertension, rheumatoid arthritis, osteoporosis, obesity, and several types of cancers," said Sessions. "Participants will also be informed of actions which may be taken to reduce their risk or improve the outcome of the disease."

A total of 168 DGMC staff volunteered to participate in the study. While DGMC served as the program's launch pad, additional Air Force medical treatment facilities have been identified for recruitment events over the course of the next several months. The PC2-Z program plans to enroll more than 2,000 individuals into the study by January 2013. NMCSO Ophthalmology Clinic Residency Program receives maximum level accreditation

SAN DIEGO — Naval Medical Center San Diego's (NMCSO) Ophthalmology Clinic received the maximum level of accreditation for its residency program from the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) through April 2017.

To maintain accreditation, NMCSO's Ophthalmology Clinic residency program must ensure continuous oversight and undergo internal review by an ACGME residency review committee demonstrating that accreditation standards are being met. Program requirements encompass program goals and objectives; required curriculum; program director and faculty qualifications and responsibilities; facilities; duty and call hours; outpatient, inpatient and surgical experience; resident research; resident evaluations; board examination passing rates, and quality improvement projects.

"Our residency program received a five-year continued full accreditation from ACGME. The national average cycle length for Ophthalmology is four years," said NMCSO's, Program Director, Department of Ophthalmology, Cmdr. Sayjal Patel.

Accreditation is a voluntary process of evaluation and review performed by the ACGME. The goals of accreditation are to evaluate, improve and publicly recognize graduate medical education programs that meet or exceed ACGME standards. Most medical and surgical specialty boards require physicians to complete an ACGME-accredited residency training program to be eligible for specialty certification. In addition, programs must be ACGME-accredited in order to receive federal graduate medical education funds.

Chaos breeds confidence in NTC mass casualty exercise

FORT IRWIN, Calif. – Business is normal on your forward operating base in the middle of the desert, until suddenly you hear rounds popping in the distance and colliding with the ground.

Your world goes to shake.

Within minutes, ambulatory Stryker vehicles are rushing casualties to your aid station as silence turns to screams and Soldiers who were once walking and smiling are now sprinting and shouting.

Everywhere, medics are jotting down vitals, hooking up intravenous fluids and frantically tearing open gauze packets. Some wounded are missing limbs; some are violently calling the medics idiots, pleading desperately for their comrades.

“Captain Stone was just here!” one of them yells, lying on an operating table.

A chaplain – a tiny Bible in hand – kneels down beside a Soldier on a stretcher and bows his head. Together, they recite a prayer.

It’s mass confusion; it’s chaos.

Welcome to the National Training Center.

Here, the situation can change at a moment’s notice and the craziness can escalate in the blink of an eye, but for medics and other Soldiers with the 702nd Brigade Support Battalion on FOB Denver – a mock southern Afghanistan base – chaos is welcomed with well-rehearsed performance.

Soldiers with the battalion harnessed their A game June 12 when a normal day turned into a mass casualty exercise with injured role players designed to test the entire FOB, but especially medics with the battalion’s medical company.

The test served as just part of nearly an entire month of training the battalion is undergoing with the rest of its parent unit, the 4th Stryker Brigade Combat Team, 2nd Infantry Division, in preparation for a deployment to Afghanistan this fall.

“It allows our medics to be exposed to crisis management, and to have a lot of personnel coming into an aid station at one time to really cause a lot of chaos for them,” said Command Sgt. Maj. Anthony Fournutia, a New Orleans native and the battalion’s commander. “When you have role players come in, it makes it really realistic for them and gets that adrenaline flowing.”

For the battalion’s company of medics, Company C, the mission was to take in casualties from two separate battalion aid stations on the base that serve as the first level of medical care for their Soldiers.

Company C operated as a second-level treatment facility, and cared for and evacuated approximately 35 wounded via Strykers and helicopters to more permanent care.

With so many moving pieces, chaos ultimately prevailed, even for the most seasoned medics on ground. But often times even the most intense pressure and stress can solidify confidence.

“If the Soldiers know what their capabilities are before they go downrange, it builds their confidence,” he said. “And for every warrior who goes downrange, if they don’t have confidence performing their duties, it would be pretty hard for them to execute their mission.”

Eight-year medic Sgt. Brenda Porto knows from experience that the sentiment is true for any medic.

“We get these scenarios in real life, so they need to be able to understand how to handle the stressors while we’re here and cope with them,” said Porto, a Las Vegas native and a C Co. medic. “And if they learn how to do that here, it’ll be better once overseas.”

“Any sort of experience – once you sort of know what to expect – it keeps you cool and calm. You won’t freak out as much.”

The company’s first sergeant, 1st Sgt. Kristopher Rick, said his Soldiers have rehearsed similar exercises at their home station, Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Wash., and twice at Yakima Training Center in Central Washington State.

But while the unit was well versed on what to expect, it hasn’t yet rehearsed a mass casualty to such a large scale.

“It is very, very rare to have the opportunity to rehearse that at a FOB level that has more than one tenant unit,” said Rick, a Yuma, Ariz., native. “You don’t usually get to experience that until you get on site (during deployment).”

Rick knows the value of preparation, because when he walked up on his first real-life mass casualty in 2003 while deployed to Afghanistan, he should have had more of it.

“We did a three-day ground assault convoy, I rolled up onto my FOB after not sleeping for 72 hours with my physician assistant in the back to a guy running in front of my truck, stopping and saying, ‘hey, doc, we got a mass casualty at the Forward Surgical Team.’”

Rick, then a staff sergeant, walked in on 16 troops in varying condition. They had run into a firefight; none were wearing protective armor.

“They had been in a big gun fight,” he remembered. “That was a chaotic event.”

“The only way to manage that chaos is to rehearse it,” he said, adding that his unit wasn’t nearly as prepared for such an event as the infantry and artillery battalions in the 4th Stryker Brigade and his company of medics is currently.

“The more you do it, the more you learn,” he added. “That’s what we’re trying to do for the Raider brigade is get it down before we go downrange.”

Even Pvt. Jaime Medina, one of the company’s

newest medics, knows how real the possibility is that an actual mass casualty can occur downrange. He plans on being ready if the time comes.

“You should always hope for the best and prepare for the worst,” said Medina, a Las Vegas native. “It’s a very real possibility, and I like that we train like this.”

But no matter the level of preparation, the chaos will always linger.

“In a mass casualty, there’s chaos regardless, even if you have experience in it,” said Porto after the exercise.

“The scenario’s always different, so you can’t avoid it.”

Keesler member has given six gallons of blood

KEESLER AIR FORCE BASE, Miss. -- A self-declared "avid blood donor" has given six gallons of the life-saving fluid to the Keesler Blood Donor Center since he began in 1994.

Jake Jacobsen, a member of the 81st Communications Squadron, visited the center May 18 and rolled up his sleeve one more time to provide a unit of blood, making a total of six gallons, 48 pints, since he started donating here.

As he explained, "I have been an avid blood donor at Keesler since 1994, when we were on green portable cots at the Keesler Fire Department. I walk through these doors every 56 days, get a painless stick and donate a pint of my blood. It is the best feeling in the world to watch that bag filling up, knowing I am able to save the lives of three people with my blood donation. There is never enough blood. Everyone should donate at least once in their lives; it does make a difference. A single hour, a single needle, a single pint of blood -- three lives."

He noted he was wearing a special T-shirt for the occasion. "I wore this shirt for the first time today. I've had it for about 10 years and wanted to honor the blood donor center and the lives they save."

Jacobsen said he actually began donating blood in the late 70s or early 80s.

"Now my goal is 10 gallons. I still have a while to go at Keesler, so why stop now?"

According to Lisa Lynn, BDC blood recruiter, the closest donor to Jacobsen is Susan Gardner with the 334th Training Squadron. She has given five gallons to date.

The Keesler Blood Donor Center conducts sponsored blood drives, but encourages anyone wishing to donate to schedule online at www.militaryblood.dod.mil. The center also accommodates "walk-ins" 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

I am not a law professional, but even to an Aeronautical Engineer the charges, witnesses, evidence, etc. seem weak and contrived for purposes contrary to reality. There is not a chance in the world that Scott would spend his time, energy or reputation to travel to a disaster zone, anywhere, particularly

in his own state to impersonate anyone, steal from anyone, take advantage of anyone. This is a man who has spent his entire life, building his reputation helping others and taking charge of nasty situations that could strike fear in the heart of angels. He has fed the hungry, comforted and treated the battered all over the world, using his own funds and time he could have devoted to his own family and personal relationships and endangering his own health and safety to do so.

FORT SAM HOUSTON, TEXAS — An over 55 athlete from the U.S. Army Medical Information Technology Center (USAMITC) recently competed in the National Veterans Golden Age Games in St. Louis, Mo., and brought home three medals—two gold and one silver. Col. Terry Shanahan, (U.S. Army, Retired) of USAMITC's Project Management Division (PMD), won gold medals in the javelin and shot put, and a silver medal in the discus throw.


Shanahan was already a member of the Texas Throwers, a network of men and women of all ages who enjoy competing in the discus, shot-put, javelin, and hammer and weights. He competed, and still competes regularly in Texas Senior State Game competitions held all over Texas for athletes 50 and above, and in the National Senior Games held all over the U.S.

A Navy veteran and a fellow member of the Texas Throwers told Shanahan about the National Veterans Golden Age Games in St. Louis for veterans over 55. In these games, nearly 1,000 athletes competed in a choice of "15 events ranging from cycling and swimming to checkers and shuffleboard." Shanahan competed because they offered the discus, shot put and javelin.

Shanahan joined these groups and competitions as a way to "stay fit, stay in shape and to get back into the game," as he put it. "The oldest guy on the Texas Throwers is 90, and he throws the hammer," said Shanahan. He said the oldest thrower he knows of anywhere is a 91 year old discus thrower.



Agreement signed

Posttraumatic stress disorder is a common anxiety disorder that can stem from any traumatic event experienced by an individual. While there are medications currently approved by the FDA to treat this disorder, they are not sufficiently effective in treating combat-related PTSD commonly seen in Service members and Veterans.

The U.S. Army Medical Materiel Development Activity's Neurotrauma and Psychological Health Project Management Office signed an inter-agency agreement with the Veterans Affairs Cooperative Studies Program to jointly conduct and support clinical studies of pharmacotherapeutics for the treatment of combat-related PTSD in Service members and Veterans.

"The interagency agreement between USAMMDA and VACSP structures how the agencies will collaborate," said Maj. Gary Wynn, research psychiatrist with the Neurotrauma and Psychological Health Project Management Office. "While the DoD may be funding the research effort, the VA is an equal partner in the project."

He also said, "The VA is the primary location for Veterans to receive care so we need to be looking at their populations as well as those still on active duty."

USAMMDA and VACSP will be working together to identify and develop alternate indications for existing FDA-approved drugs used to treat other disorders.

"While these drugs are FDA-approved, they are not approved for the treatment of PTSD," said Wynn. "In fact, many of the drugs currently being used have little or no research supporting their off-label use in treating PTSD."




