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## HELPING SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIMS START THE HEALING PROCESS

WASHINGTON — In 2012, aboard his last ship, Navy Culinary Specialist 1st Class Antonio T. Granderson saw first hand the impact sexual assault can have on a person.

A chief petty officer began to have an inappropriate relationship with a female Sailor. He made unwanted gestures toward her and ultimately attempted to have sex with her. His actions caused an extreme change in her behavior.

“She went from being bubbly and outgoing to always being down, looking tired and drained ... like she was fighting a fight she couldn’t win,” he recalled. “Seeing her let me know the extreme effect [sexual assault] has on you. It was a very depressing and eye opening situation to me.”

Seeing the struggle people face first hand, he decided he wanted to help others in their time of need, so he became a victim advocate.

“A lot of times people feel like there is nobody to talk to in those situations,” he said. “I just wanted to put that badge on me and say ‘Hey, if you need someone to talk to you can come talk to me.’”

As a victim advocate, Granderson’s job is to give people support and let them know they have options. If someone is involved in a situation and are unsure of what to do, he says the first step should be to call for help, using either the DoD hotline at 1-877-995-5247 or JBAB victim advocate line at 202-258-6717. The DoD hotline number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Victims don’t have to give their names. They can ask questions freely to gather information and determine what kind of treatment they need (medical or psychiatric) and what course of action they can take (knowing the pros and cons of their reporting options). Victim advocates are there to help them make the best decision possible.

“The one thing we don’t want to do is re-victimize the victim,” he said. “As victim advocates we want to give the control back to [them].”

Since becoming a victim advocate in 2014, Granderson has not had a military case, something he says is a good sign people are learning. For sexual assault to get stamped out completely, he says we all have to do our part.

## Naval Hospital Bremerton raises awareness for veterans lost to suicide

**W**hen Naval Hospital Bremerton staff members dropped and gave 22 for 22 on 22, every pushup completed was more than just a symbolic reminder of a servicemember lost.

It was also an inclusive, hands-on and hands-down reminder of the daily pervasive struggle that

leads 22 veterans a day to commit suicide.

The ‘22 Pushup Challenge for Veteran’s Suicide Awareness’ was organized at NHB by Hospital Corpsman 3rd Class Elaina McMillian for April 22, 2016 after hearing about the idea and deciding to make it happen at her command.

“I just thought this would be a good way to get a lot of us involved by at least reminding us on

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the compassion and empathy needed to help end this number. 22 is such a large number," said McMillian.

A recent Veterans Affairs study carried out over a two-year span reported that nearly 14 percent of veterans reported suicidal thinking.

McMillian wanted to drive home the point that veterans aren't just some abstract percentage, but that one in seven of their numbers is contemplating taking their own life, with 22 actually doing that on a daily basis.

"We're a military treatment facility. Do we have programs and processes in place to help? Yes, we do. Can we do more to take care of our own? Yes, we can. The struggle to complete the challenge we hope will help give all of us a tiny glimpse into the struggle our veterans are facing every day. All our pushups help," McMillian stated.

Suicides do not just impact prior service members. As of April 4, 2016, there have also been nine Navy active duty and three Navy Reserve Sailors lost to suicide.

For Hospital Corpsman 1st Class Geoffrey Sims, when he heard about the '22 Pushup Challenge,' he immediately knew what he had to do.

"I had to give 44. I lost two friends. When I read about the challenge, it gave me a chill and really hit home. It made

me realize that we all can do more," shared Sims.

"Being involved in this is going to help maintain awareness. C'mon everyone," added Hospital Corpsman 2nd Class Jason Alexander.

McMillian is counting each pushup as a launching pad that everyone can use on a daily basis. The 22 pushups are a start.

NHB Command Master Chief Randy Pruitt also helped spread the word about the campaign by challenging Naval Medical Center San Diego and Naval Hospital Okinawa to match NHB in the task, pushup to pushup.

"This is such a great idea and one that we need to constantly remind ourselves about. Helping out shipmates is what we do," Pruitt said.

According to Lt. Shawn Redmon, Naval Hospital Bremerton chaplain, sometimes it can be simple "ACTs" of kindness that can help save a life.

"I hope everyone realizes that a simple act of kindness can make all the difference in the world to someone who's hurting," said Redmon, noting that if anyone encounters anyone showing extensive signs of depression with a possible risk of suicide, to remember to ACT, an acronym for Ask, Care, and Treat.

Ask - ask someone if they are thinking of suicide.

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# Mason hosts Command Health and Wellness Fair

NORFOLK — Sailors aboard the guided-missile destroyer USS Mason (DDG 87) participated in a health and wellness fair organized by Mason's health services division in preparation for an upcoming deployment with the Eisenhower Carrier Strike Group (Ike CSG).

Mason's health and wellness fair began with a welcome speech from Mason's commanding officer, Cmdr. Christopher J. Gilbertson.

"I'm appreciative of the time each and every one of you took to come out today," Gilbertson said. "It shows not only your commitment to yourself but also your dedication to the crew."

Gilbertson went on to say that education and awareness empowers Mason Sailors to make informative decisions.

Sailors received advice about self-assessment from a qualified group of professionals in the areas of counseling, alcohol awareness and prevention, parenting, fitness, health and wellness.

"It's great to see all the Sailors coming out to support," said Hospitalman Miriam A. Harsha, a member of Naval Medical Center Portsmouth (NMCP)'s nutrition and weight loss program. "It's even better when they come and tell us about the amazing lifestyle changes that they've made."

Mason was visited by representatives from NMCP, Fleet and Family Support Center, Navy Morale, Welfare and Recreation Mid-Atlantic, Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society, Defense Health Agency Immunization Healthcare Branch, and TRICARE.

"Everything we do is about mission readiness," said Lt. j.g. Eileen M. Maher of NMCP. "We encourage Sailors to be aware and seek support from the websites and resources we have available. If they're able to do their best for themselves, then they'll be more likely to commit to each other."

During the three-hour fair that attracted more than 100 visitors to nine information kiosks, Mason's health services division administered anthrax vaccinations to the crew.

"Even though I am new to the team, I can see that Mason's health division is a well-oiled machine," Crowley said. "I have zero doubts of their professionalism and preparation in edu-

cating and treating Mason's crew."

Along with Mason, Ike CSG includes the Carrier Strike Group (CSG) 10 staff, Destroyer Squadron (DESRON) 26 staff, the aircraft carrier USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN 69), Carrier Air Wing (CVW) 3, the guided-missile cruisers USS San Jacinto (CG 56) and USS Monterey (CG 61), and the

DESRON 26 ships: guided-missile destroyers USS Stout (DDG 55), USS Roosevelt (DDG 80) and USS Nitze (DDG 94).

initially engaged schools to determine if outdated sanitation or hygiene infrastructure could be a contributing factor to chronic child illnesses within the local district.

The team developed the curriculum and worked with the JMTG-U senior medical officer and the district director of education to finalize the curriculum for delivery in local schools. The team instructed students in five schools as part of the health awareness program.

“I feel like this is going to help make a differ-

ence in the community and make kids healthier, stronger and smarter,” said Spc. Shayden Young, a combat medic, 80th Civil Affairs Battalion. “Hopefully this school will talk to other schools and they spread the word around about the health concepts that we taught them,” Young added.

At the end of the class, the civil affairs team gave out gifts to students and took time to interact with the children in order to strengthen bonds with the local community.

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
